



SRA Handbook Consultation: Will you have a say about the future of your profession?

Deadline for responses - 21 September 2016 - approaching fast!

The SRA is proposing to radically simplify your Handbook, including:

- two separate codes of conduct - one for solicitors and another for regulated entities
- reducing the existing ten principles in the code down to six, including the removal of rule 5 and rule 10
- permitting solicitors to deliver non reserved legal services to the public from organisations that are not regulated by the SRA or any other legal services regulator

The implication of these proposals could have far reaching consequences for your practice and your profession.

The Law Society would like to invite you to attend an event in Cambridge, to discuss the consultation. The event will provide an overview of the proposals and give an opportunity for members of the profession to assess and discuss the implications of the proposed changes. Members will also be encouraged to submit individual consultation responses to the SRA.
